Parishes Praised at Parish Forum

Parish councils have a crucial role in raising the standards of waste services, Mendip District Council's (MDC) parish forum was told by Somerset Waste Partnership (SWP).

While positive feedback is welcome, reports of poor service, especially if repeated - from materials dropped by crews to box damage, litter from open truck flaps to noise, or problems at any recycling site - are vital to correct errors.

Parish councils should collate full details, such as location of incidents, including postcode, dates and times, and contact information, and pass that to SWP via MDC customer services: 0300 303 8588 or customerservices@mendip.gov.uk.

But parishes were reminded that waste crews are not litter pickers or street sweepers; until kerbside waste is collected, it remains residents' responsibility to keep tidy, including any that escapes from recycling boxes.

To avoid littering, once all containers are rinsed, all materials should be squashed except glass and aerosols, and recycling boxes are stacked with the locked food waste bin on top to stop items being blown out



Parishes were praised for keeping residents informed about waste, including the new materials taken at all recycling sites (though not yet at the kerbside): plastic pots, tubs and trays.

AWARDS FOR ALL ENGLAND - Grants between £300 and £10,000 for voluntary groups, schools, local authorities and health bodies in England to carry out projects that will improve their local community (applications may be made at any time).

It is one of the best small grants scheme available to community organisations in England.



Application packs are available from the <u>Awards for All England webpages</u>. This is a rolling programme in which applications may be submitted at any time.

SANTANDER FOUNDATION DISCOVERY GRANTS - Grants up to £5,000 for UK registered charities, Community Interest Companies and Credit Unions for local projects that benefit disadvantaged people (applications may be made at any time).

The <u>Santander Foundation</u>'s <u>Discovery Grants</u> scheme provides grants to charities, Community Interest Companies and Credit Unions for activities that support disadvantaged people in the UK to improve knowledge, skills and innovation in order to give them the confidence to discover, create and take advantage of new opportunities.
