## 1.0 BACKGROUND

Members will aware that following discussions between Cabinet and the Senior Leadership Team earlier this year, the Council welcomed a Peer Team, coordinated by the Local Government Association, into the offices to conduct a Corporate Peer Challenge between 28<sup>th</sup> February and 2<sup>nd</sup> March 2017.

Peer Challenges are a tool developed by the LGA, which are available to all Councils, as an approach to sector led improvement within local government. In making the decision to invite a Peer Challenge it was felt that it would provide us with a valuable opportunity to engage with a team of Officer and Member Peers from across the sector to review the progress that we have made over recent years and to consider our plans for the future, and in particular the challenge of securing financial sustainability by 2020.

The Peer Challenge took place between 28<sup>th</sup> February and 2<sup>nd</sup> March 2017, and during this period the Team considered 5 areas that are common to all Challenges, those being:

- Understanding of the local place and priority setting
- Leadership of place
- Financial planning
- Organisational leadership and governance
- Capacity to deliver

In addition to these 'common' areas of challenge, we have also specifically requested that the Team consider the following important areas:

- Our work on the economic growth and productivity agenda, and
- Our strategic positioning (ie within Somerset, regionally and nationally)
- Our work with Somerset CC and the potential for further collaboration
