LOCAL AUTHORITIES TRAFFIC ORDERS (PROCEDURE) (ENGLAND AND WALES) REGULATIONS 1996 MENDIP DISTRICT COUNCIL (OFF-STREET PARKING PLACES) ORDER 2018

NOTICE OF MAKING

Notice is hereby given that on the 18th day of September 2018 Mendip District Council, in exercise of its powers under Sections 35 and 124 (and Part IV of Schedule 9) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as "the 1984 Act") and the Traffic Management Act 2004 (hereinafter referred to as "the 2004 Act"), made an order which made provision for parking places throughout the district of Mendip and to control the use and charge for such parking places. The Order brings into force the introduction of Sunday charges in Frome and Shepton Mallet and a variation in parking charges across the District as set out in the Notice of Proposals, and otherwise repeats the parking restrictions set out in Mendip District Council (Off-Street Parking Places) Order 2017 which is revoked in full as from 30th September 2018.

The Order will come into force on 1st day of October 2018.

If any person wishes to question the validity of this Order or of any of its provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the Act, or that any requirement of the Act or of any instrument made under the Act has not been complied with, that person may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the order is made, apply to the High Court for that purpose.
