

# Lottery Community Fund opens for grant applications in Mendip



A grant pot of up to £10,000 has opened up this week with funds which have been raised through a Mendip Community Lottery.

Mendip District Council have opened the Shape Mendip Community Fund for applications this week. The fund, which shares the proceeds of the Shape Mendip Lottery, gives Mendip organisations the chance of securing a £500 grant towards projects benefitting the Mendip community.

The Shape Mendip Lottery is a weekly lottery that directly supports good causes which benefit the Mendip community.

When playing the Shape Mendip Lottery 60% of your ticket price goes to good causes and the money raised really helps benefit the local community.

Players can choose an organisation to support from the signed up causes or they can opt to support the Shape Mendip Community Fund. It's the donations from that fund that are now being made available as £500 grants.

Cllr Philip Ham, portfolio holder for Transformation at Mendip District Council, said: "The Shape Mendip Lottery was set up to help raise funds for local community and voluntary groups and the vital work they do within Mendip.

"It's great that we are now in a position to run the Community Fund from the funds raised through the lottery. The total grant pot of up to £10,000 will have a positive impact on local communities across the district.



We are looking forward to seeing the variety of applications we will receive for projects across Mendip.”

## Hydrotherapy pool in Street gets a funding boost from local council with a grant of £25,000.

Mendip District Council presented Avalon School, based in Street Somerset, with a cheque for £25,000 during the school assembly last week.

Cllr Dick Skidmore Chairman of Mendip District Council together with Cllr Philip Ham and Vice Chairman Cllr Bryan Beha made the presentation to Laura Searle Head teacher of Avalon School.

The Hydrotherapy Pool planned at Avalon School will be built within the grounds and has been carefully designed to provide an excellent facility when finished, with the scope for further development in the future. Once built the Hydrotherapy Pool will provide the school with a facility meeting Sport England’s guidance, three changing cubicles, three large showers, one accessible bathroom and changing room and a small changing room for groups.



Laura Searle, Head Teacher, from Avalon School, said: 'It's so wonderful to have reached our target, with the help of our community here and the Local Legacy Fund, and we're now excited looking to get the build under way and fundraise for the equipment we need to ensure everyone gets the most out of the pool'.

The funding boost from the council follows on from the Local Legacy Fund which was set up back in 2015 and was administered by Mendip District Council. The Local Legacy Fund was intended for parish or town councils, local voluntary and community organisations, social enterprises and community interest companies.

Now closed the Local Legacy Fund supported eligible projects, in order to qualify the projects needed to take place in the Mendip District Council area and provide a lasting benefit to local communities and residents.

Cllr Philip Ham, Portfolio Holder for Transformation, said: "We are delighted to be supporting this project as the introduction of a Hydrotherapy Pool at Avalon School will provide benefits for not only the pupils but for residents across Mendip.

"Although now finalised with this final grant, the Local Legacy Fund has supported a number of projects across the district that like the Hydrotherapy pool will have a lasting impact on the lives of residents in Mendip."

Cllr Dick Skidmore, said: "It's great to see what a difference this money will make the Hydrotherapy Pool is a great addition to the facilities already available in Mendip."

The funding from Mendip District Council along with funds raised by pupils from the school, a donation from a Hong Kong based charity and a grant from St James's Place Foundation now means that work can commence on the pool.

## Mendip backs initiative to help residents cut their fuel bills

Mendip District Council is once again backing the popular Big Community Switch which is a collective energy switching scheme which has seen some local residents save hundreds of pounds by switching their energy supplier.

Collective Energy Switching is when consumers get together to negotiate a group deal with gas and electricity suppliers, with a third party actively negotiating a better tariff on behalf of the group through an auction process.

There is a vast array of options for people looking to compare the market and switch suppliers either individually or collectively. Mendip District Council is continuing to back The Big Community Switch run by iChoosr as one way of helping Mendip's residents get a better deal on their energy bills.



The amount saved will vary, but in previous rounds of energy switching that involved Mendip residents, people who signed up to the scheme saved an average of £205.88 on their annual fuel bills.

The Big Community Switch, which is open to all Mendip residents, aims to help prevent people slipping into fuel poverty by making easier and more convenient for people to participate in energy switching.

The way the process works is:

- Residents visit iChoosr's Big Community Switch website – [www.bigcommunityswitch.com](http://www.bigcommunityswitch.com) - where they can follow a simple online process to register their interest.
- Up to five households can be registered on one email address and residents without internet access will be supported through the registration process by the council.
- Mendip residents are then pooled with other local authority schemes and energy companies bid against each other in a reverse auction to offer the group of customers the best deal.
- A no-obligation offer is then sent to each resident who has registered in the scheme and they have a month to choose whether to accept it.
- If residents choose to accept their offer they are then switched to the new supplier and supported to ensure a smooth and hassle-free transfer.

The collective energy scheme is now open until the auction on 12 February 2019.

Cllr Philip Ham, Portfolio Holder for Transformation, said: "Collective Energy Switching has already proved extremely popular, with people in Mendip saving an average of £205 on their annual fuel bills.

"This is a great opportunity for people to be in with a chance of making a very impressive saving on their energy bills, so I would encourage local people to take part – it really is a quick and straightforward process."

Mendip District Council has partnered with iChoosr, a leading expert in collective energy switching, to operate the scheme in the district.

## THE FUTURE HIGH STREETS FUND – NOW OPEN TO APPLICATIONS

**New £675 million grant programme for public and private sector partnerships to make high streets and town centres in England fit for the future by improving infrastructure, reducing congestion, supporting redevelopment, boosting housing and creating workspaces.**

**Expression of Interest deadline: Friday 22 March 2019.**

The **Future High Streets Fund**, which the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government (MHCLG) has just opened to applications, is a competitive funding programme designed to renew and reshape town centres and high streets in England in a way that improves experience, drives growth and ensures future sustainability.

MHCLG would expect to see Expressions of Interest come forward with proof of engagement with, and support from, a number of stakeholders including the following (where applicable):

- o Mayoral and non-Mayoral Combined Authorities;
- o Local Enterprise Partnerships (LEPs);
- o Other tiers of local government in the area;
- o Business Improvement Districts;
- o The private sector; and
- o Community groups

The following are **not** eligible for funding:

- o Expanding traditional retail on a high street as such proposals should be funded commercially, or for short term enhancements or promotions;
- o Town centre areas that are not facing significant challenges; or
- o Proposals that cover entire city regions, rather than a single high street or town centre, will not be eligible for funding.

There is a 2-stage application process.

The deadline for applications for Phase 1 calls for local authorities to submit Expressions of Interest to [highstreetsfund@communities.gov.uk](mailto:highstreetsfund@communities.gov.uk), setting out their challenges and strategic approach to regenerating town centres, is: **Friday 22 March 2019**.

The aim of **Comic Relief's Children Survive and Thrive Fund** is to support child-centred approaches and make progress in addressing the comprehensive development needs of children during their early years, up to and including their transition to primary school. These child-centred approaches should be based on recognised good practice.

The programme is open to applications now and has a deadline of 12 noon on Friday 22 March 2019. There is a two stage application process.

## **DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL CARE - VOLUNTARY, COMMUNITY AND SOCIAL ENTERPRISE (VCSE) HEALTH AND WELL-BEING FUND 2019-2020**

**Application deadline: 12 noon, Friday 15 February 2019**

Through this programme, the Department of Health and Social Care, NHS England and Public Health England are working with Voluntary, Community and Social Enterprise (VCSE) organisations in England to promote equality, address health inequalities and support the well-being of people, families and communities.

Applications are invited from existing schemes to trial a new approach to helping children and young people with their mental health.

Up to £510,000 is available per applicant over a 3 year period.

**THE PRINCE'S COUNTRYSIDE FUND – Grants up to £50,000 for UK projects that will have a long-term sustainable impact on rural communities, with grants of up to £25,000 available for community shops, village halls and pubs.**

### **1. Sustaining Rural Communities**

- o Projects that deliver assets and services that keep isolated communities together and develop a more sustainable rural economy;
- o Developing sustainable rural community assets, businesses and services; and/or

- o Providing advice and new skills and business training that benefit the local economy.

## **2. Improving the prospects of viability for farm and rural businesses**

- o Projects that will focus on developing stronger, more sustainable farm businesses and other rural enterprises with the aim of halting the decline of the rural economy;
- o Encouraging local food production and short supply chains and knowledge transfer e.g. farmer networks; and/or
- o Providing new skills and training for rural, and agricultural benefit.

## **3. Supporting Aid Delivery in Emergency and Building Resilience**

- o Projects that support farm businesses, rural businesses and communities to plan for and recover from natural disasters such as flooding or animal disease and build resilience.

Registered charities, Community Interest Companies, Social Enterprises, other forms of not-for-profit organisations, Companies Limited by Guarantee, Community Benefit Societies and Unincorporated Organisations may apply for a maximum of £50,000.

Shops, pubs, or village hall projects (inclusive of VAT) may apply for a grant of £25,000 for a maximum period of three years.

The next deadline for applications is **Thursday 21 February 2019**.

Applicants will be expected to supply a clear business plan which outlines their intended activities and projected financial situation over the duration of the project.

Disability groups and programmes, clubs, schools and associations in the UK may apply for a grant of up to £1,500. Organisations that are applying in order to purchase a wheelchair are expected to provide a level of match funding.

**THE VETERANS COMMUNITY CENTRES PROGRAMME - Capital grants up to £150,000 for Armed Forces charities in the UK to renovate or refurbish community halls used by veterans and their communities.**

**Application deadline: Monday 11 March 2019.**

The programme offers two funding streams:

- 1. Band A grants** of up to and including £30,000 to fund the total cost of the project (including VAT). Band A grants are available across the three funding rounds.
- 2. Band B grants** of between £30,000 and £150,000 will only be available in the third funding round and awarded in February 2020. These grants are for more complex projects, and it is mandatory that applicants discuss their project with the Trust before 4pm on 27 September 2019.

Applications will only be accepted from Armed Forces organisations that are registered charities or Community Interest Companies (CIC).

**THE W. G. EDWARDS CHARITABLE FOUNDATION – Grants up to £3,000 for registered charities providing care for older people aged 65 and over within the UK**

**THE RURAL FOUR GRANT PROGRAMME** - Up to 10 grants of £25,000 are available each year for rural community projects in England, Scotland and Wales that aim to improve the well-being of isolated communities in deprived areas, particularly for projects that tackle isolation and improve the health and well-being of people living in sparsely populated areas.

**Application deadline: none – applications may be made at any time.** The [Rural Four Grant Programme](#) is a Prince's Countryside Fund grant programme that provides support for community projects in England, Scotland and Wales. The project seeks to reach out and engage with up to 10 rural communities annually to help deliver and reinvigorate community assets and services.

Applications may be made at any time and are considered every 3 months.

[Comic Relief's Tech for Good](#) programme provides an opportunity for not-for-profit organisations that already have some technological capacity to take their digital innovation projects forward to create social change by delivering new ideas or more effective digital services.

Applications will next be accepted from **Monday 11 February 2019 to Monday 25 March 2019**.

Applicants are therefore strongly advised to apply as soon as possible after the programme opens to applications.
