Annex 1

Mandatory conditions

The licence is granted subject to the Mandatory Conditions for the sale of alcohol by retail as set out in the Licensing Act 2003 as amended by the Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2010 and Order 2014.

Supply of alcohol

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under this premises licence:
 - a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence or,
 - b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Irresponsible Promotions

1. The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
2. An irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - a) Games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or;
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise).
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

Potable Water

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Age Verification

1. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
2. The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
3. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—

- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

Small Measures

The responsible person must ensure that—

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml.

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.”

Alcohol minimum permitted price

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 –

(a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979

(b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

Where—

i) P is the permitted price,

ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—

i) the holder of the premises licence;

ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence;

or

iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) “valued added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Door Supervisors

1. Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each such individual must:
 - (a) be authorised to carry out that activity by a licence granted under the Private Security Industry Act 2001; or
 - (b) be entitled to carry out that activity by virtue of section 4 of the Act.
2. But nothing in subsection (1) requires such a condition to be imposed:
 - (a) in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films); or
 - (b) in respect of premises in relation to:
 - (i) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
 - (ii) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).
3. For the purposes of this section:
 - (a) “security activity” means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and, which is licensable conduct for the purposes of that Act, (see Section 3(2) of that Act) and
 - (b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

Annex 2

Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

1. CCTV shall be maintained and in full working order, at all times that the premises is open for the carrying out of licensable activities, to the satisfaction of the Police and Licensing Authority
2. A capacity limit shall be set at 100 customers.
3. Door supervisors shall ensure the capacity limits are controlled.
4. The premises licence holder/ designated premises supervisor/ other appropriate member of staff shall be an active member of the local Pub Watch scheme (or other similar scheme where there is no Pub Watch)
5. Free drinking water shall be available at all times when the premise is open to the public.
6. A chill out area shall be provided.
7. Seats shall be available to accommodate 60% of the maximum capacity of the premises.

8. On the evenings when the premises carry out regulated entertainment after midnight there will be one member of door staff on duty at the main entrance to the premises.
9. Door staff shall commence their duties at 2300.hours and remain on duty until closure of the premise.
10. On any day that the premise trades for the sale of alcohol beyond 2300.hours drinks from glass bottles shall be decanted into toughened or plastic glasses.
11. Customers carrying open or sealed bottles or glasses shall not be permitted to the premises at any time.
12. Customers shall not be permitted to take open containers of alcoholic or soft drinks from the premises.
13. All bottles and glasses shall be removed from public areas as soon as practicable.
14. Notices advising that no drugs will be allowed on the premises shall be prominently displayed.
15. All electrical installations and / or equipment shall comply, and be maintained in accordance with the relevant British Standards or relevant legislation.
16. All Fire detection, emergency lighting and alarms shall comply, and be maintained in accordance with the relevant British Standards or relevant legislation.
17. All Gas installations and / or equipment shall comply, and be maintained in accordance with the relevant British Standards or relevant legislation.
18. All Plant installations and equipment shall comply, and be maintained in accordance with the relevant British Standards or relevant legislation.
19. All staff induction shall include dealing with emergency evacuation of the premises.
20. Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
21. The placing of bottles into receptacles outside the premises shall only be permitted to take place between the hours of 0900 hours and 1700 hours.
22. All staff shall be trained with regard to Somerset Trading Standards best practice relating to age restricted sales and activities, incorporating an approved photo proof of age scheme.
23. Notices advising customers of Somerset Trading Standards regulations appertaining to age restricted products and the sale of alcohol, shall be prominently displayed.

Amendments agreed with Environmental Protection.

1. The Premises Licence holder or a nominated deputy, shall take all reasonable steps to effect full control over all noise sources arising from the premises having particular regard to amplified and non-amplified music. The Premises Licence holder or a nominated deputy shall, where necessary, arrange for the volume of any music to be reduced or the playing ceased if, in the opinion of the Licensing Authority, reasonable cause for annoyance is likely to arise or is occurring. The Premises Licence holder shall ensure that at least one such responsible person be available on the premises at all times (contactable by Officers of the Licensing Authority), whilst members of the public remain on the premises.

2. Noise from music and entertainment events shall not be audible within any noise sensitive premises between the hours of 23:00 hours and 7:00am (8:00am Sundays).
3. All entrance/exit doors shall be kept closed during all music and entertainment events except for the purpose of allowing access or egress.
4. All external windows shall be kept closed during music and entertainment events.
